
Activities continued into evening

LETTERS

Just a note from down under ... As I rode this year, I experienced a variety of rides and realized that not all rides are created equal. Of course, I'm not saying they should be, however I believe that a good basic foundation stabilizes and enhances a ride and creates a desire for people to put that ride on their next year's list. I could write pages on what goes into a good ride but I would like to encourage management to follow the essentials:

We all got used to ribbons on the right and in bright pink so as to not blend in with some landscapes (maybe we are just creatures of habit).

Timing as described in the rule book is 3.4 to 4 MPH for Novice and 4-5 MPH for Open. Steep terrain, rough rocky trail, downed timber sometimes creates a slower time or shorter mileage. I for one am not faint of heart and enjoy a challenging trail, but a couple rides went by in a blur this year (and not because I was underneath my horse at the time). I would still like to enjoy the beautiful views we have and not feel like I am on an endurance ride.

Trailmasters should know the trail, how to time the trails and use the same horse for both days timing to get an accurate account. Horse pedometers are available.

If you've experienced cancellation of a ride, several riders being pulled or critiques with several complaints, go back and consider some of the basic elements that go into a good ride. We would like to keep all of our rides in 1993 and would not like to see these rides get dropped from our ride schedule.

One idea we have tried that seems to be working in the SW area is a management committee. We have five rides in this area (maybe six in 1993) with a core of management people that rotate managing the rides and offer total support for the other rides. We also have received support financially from the 4C Arabian Club to insure a ride does not go bust. When people volunteer to manage a ride without start-up money, it imposes unnecessary worry for

these people. Region 3 should look into start-up money for these rides. A 1993 goal needs to be keeping, supporting and creating rides.

One other thought about our sport. A rider is a consumer. We send in an entry fee of \$55-70 for a ride (which is just the beginning). Ride management owes the rider a properly timed and marked trail, good quality judges and a ride that is abreast of the rules.

Let's not forget to keep the FUNNNN in our rides.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY HIGHLIGHTS

The following is an abbreviated version of the minutes of the General Assembly meeting held at the Region 3 year-end seminar, Nov. 7, 1992:

The meeting was called to order by President Jill Talbot at 1:23 p.m. Ballots—Anyone who had not cast their ballot for the election of board members was asked to do so immediately.

Minutes – Jill read the minutes from the last board meeting, correction: profit from ride booklet \$111.19.

Treasurer's Report – Joyce Calhoun– Pat Jubb reported that more money was spent on awards this year because of the decision to update worker awards and present special awards to those who had worked so hard. She pointed out that Region 3 returns most of its money back to its riders and workers in the way of owords

Membership – Increase in rider and membership fees discussed, board recently passed a \$2.00 rider fee increase and a \$5.00 across-the-board membership dues increase. Comments were made that the fee increases should be looked into, the increases were made to bolster the general fund and supplement the national board members' traveling fund. Suggestion for a special membership fee for workers (non-riders) so that they may receive the newsletter.

Election results – New BOD members announced: Mary Lou McManaman (D-3); Sue McKelvy (At large); Dee Overholt (At large); and Susie Witter (At large).

National Appreciation Award nominations: Tom & Barb Butterfield, Bill & Jenny Smith and Dick and Lois Arbour. Sue Bretag Award nominations: Bill & Jenny Smith, Lois & Dick Arbour.

President's Cup criteria – How our National board members should vote on the President's Cup criteria changes? After much discussion a vote was taken and the following proposal was decided upon: Minimum of 17 rides in three regions with the ability to toss out one ride. Dean Schrader will take our proposal to next national board meeting.

The tentative ride schedule can be found on page 2 of this issue.

Proposal to donate our usual \$100 to NATRC for year-end awards motion, passed.

REGIONAL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The following is an abbreviated version of the minutes of the Region 3 board of directors (BOD) meeting held at the Region 3 year-end seminar, Nov. 8,

Meeting called to order by President Jill Talbot, motion to suspend reading of previous minutes, approved.

Treasurer's Report – Joyce Calhoun–Review of income and expense report handout. Membership Report – Ike Mosgrove—1993 Membership applications ready. Year ended with 148 members, lost some, but many old-timers came back and gained a few new so we're holding steady. Discussion reopened regarding membership dues and rider fee increases: Following considerable discussion and motions, the BOD rescinded the original motion to increase both the membership and rider fees, then voted to raise the membership fees only (and reevaluate our financial status at the end of the year). Ike to revise 1993 membership Applications.

Ride reimbursement – Judd Adams— Submitted report on cancelled Van Vleet Ride to Region 3 and the Arabian Horse Club, explaining that cancellation was due to lack of workers and only 28 riders. Discussion followed as to why this happened and which club would be responsible for financial reimbursement to Judd. It was decided the IAHA was responsible since that was the sponsoring organization and Judd withdrew his request. Next board agenda item made to discuss advertising so this kind of thing does not happen again.

Insurance Policy – Discussion of lack of insurance coverage, material was passed on for review. Suggestion that nonmember riders may have to pay an additional affiliate member fee to have coverage.

Stock show booth – Unanimously approved to give up our share of booth.

Ride critiques – Judy Miller read highlights of critiques, suggested an easier format so perhaps more people will participate in filling them out. Will send to new president to be discussed in January.

Closing statements - Out-going member Kathe Hayes hopes the new board concentrates on increased membership and what the fees are doing for our members. San Juan Ride Association formed (combination of five rides in the four-corners area). Will take on responsibility for all rides in their group and raise money to buy materials for their rides. Maybe other areas could benefit by similar action. Kathe wants to be the driving force behind Region 3 putting on a Ride of Champions, put on every 2-3 years and move from region to region. Criteria for ride has to be formed, and is aiming for the first one to be held in 1995, thanks Kathe. Frank Bowman has submitted his resignation immediately as he and Stacy are moving to Illinois (boo!). Jill moved to appoint Judy Cumberworth to fill Frank's position because her area is short on

Region 3 renewal/newsletter subscription

If you haven't renewed your Region 3 membership, the cutoff date for receiving the *Region Three Newsletter* will be June 1 of the same year. National (but not Region 3) members will receive two complementary newsletters only unless they join Region 3.

Eligibility for Region 3 year-end awards

All national NATRC members who are dues-paying members to Region 3 NATRC are eligible for regional placings and awards. Requirements: Open horses and riders must enter three (3) rides per season and accumulate a minimum of 30 points to be eligible for year-end placings. Open horses and riders will be eligible for the Ruth Tyree High Average Horsemanship and Ken Burkdoll Combined High Average Horse/Rider awards if they enter a minimum of six (6) regional rides. All rides started will be counted.

Competitive Pleasure horses and riders must enter two (2) rides per season and accumulate a minimum of 20 points to be eligible for year-end placings. Competitive Pleasure horses and riders will be eligible to compete for the High Average Combined Horse/Rider award but must enter a minimum of four (4) rides per season. The top horse in Competitive Pleasure shall be considered as a sweepstakes horse within the class and shall receive 2 additional points as done in the Open and Novice divisions.

Novice horses and riders must enter two (2) rides per season and accumulate a minimum of 12 points to be eligible for year-end awards. Horses and riders receive 4 points for ride completion and a sweepstakes horse receives 2 points (18).

Memo to ride managers

Rides are requested to send the results of a ride to national within two weeks after the ride. Ride results Region 3 rider fees should be sent at the same time to the point chairman.

Verification of points and mileage

The point secretary keeps all Region 3 members' points and mileage each year. You are welcome to verify your points with the chairman by Oct. 15 of the current year, otherwise you must accept the points as calculated by the point secretary. Region 3 NATRC members who have not renewed their memberships by Mar. 1 of each year will have to pay an additional \$15 secretarial fee if they wish to have either their horse or rider points and mileage recorded. Breed award eligibility

To be eligible for breed awards at each ride, you must send in a copy of your horse's registration papers with the ride entry. This copy will be returned to you the day of the ride.
