Regional riders tops at IAHA championship

Region III open rider Neal McKinstry and his horse Schar Royal have claimed the 1993 International Arabian Horse Association (IAHA) Competitive Trail Ride Championship. The ride was held October 8-9, 1993 in the Manzano mountains east of Albuquerque, New Mexico, shortly before the IAHA U.S. National Show. The win established the seventy-fouryear-old Neal of Fruita, Colorado, and the gelding he calls "Isom," as the best competitive trail team in the United States and Canada for the year.

For Neal and Isom's efforts, they received a Gladys Brown Edwards bronze trophy, a top ten plaque and ribbon, an IAHA silver completion buckle, a saddle donated by Ulster International, Inc., a top ten horse blanket donated by Schneiders Saddlery, nutritional

supplements donated by Custom Service, Inc. and Rubbermaid, and the Ed Fischer traveling trophy. After receiving all that loot, Neal's response was "my goodness."

Isom is a 13-year-old gelding who began his career on the racetrack. Recoved from an accident when he blew his knee out, he has since become a champion competitive trail horse. Neal is a long-standing competitive rider and tireless worker for the IAHA. Neal bred Isom himself and he is by the champion show ring horse Sharif. When Neal and Isom entered the ring at the U.S. Nationals for their victory pass, Isom had to coaxed in – the look in his eyes said, "Where are the trees? The water? The rocks? I don't wanna go in there!"

Neal wasn't the only Region III rider to clean up at the Championship. An ecstatic Audrey Taylor and her 7-year-old gelding

Deylynn Moyaia picked up the Half-Arabian Champion title. She carried similar prizes home to Alameda, New Mexico. Deylynn is by El Senor, out of a mustang dam, 16.2 hands tall and weighs 1,450 pounds.

Not to be outdone by the senior regional riders, 13-year-old Lea Alsup from Bloomfield, New Mexico, won the Championship Youth Jacket for her ride on Dsah Doha. The nearly sixty years of age difference between Neal and Lea demonstrated that competitive trail riding is a lifelong sport and that sixty-six miles in the mountains can breathe life into horses and riders of all ages.

Reserve Champion Arabian was Bolero Breeze, ridden and owned by Michelle Glover of Wylie Tex. Michelle is a NATRC veterinary judge as well as a competitive rider.

Other top ten finishers include Independance Dai, ridden by Sena Fitzpatrick; Doms Samsson, ridden by Linda Werner; Sir Sea Storm, rider Jenny Smith; and SA Boomer, Lonnie Smith up.

The ride was managed extremely well by IAHA Region 8 Director Bob James. The judges were Dwight Hooten, Harrodsburg Kentucky; Jerry Weil, Great Bend, Kansas; and Joe Quintana of Farmington, New Mexico who worked pleasantly and tirelessly for three days. Trail master was Robin Claxton, the P&R captain was Steve Ancell and who else but Bill Smith made sure everyone was well-fed. IAHA President James O'Neal was present daily and told the riders that International wants to make the IAHA competitive trail ride the premier event for the sport.

Next year's event is planned for September 30-October 2 at Tanglewood Acres in the Pike State Forest near Bainbridge, Ohio.

REGIONAL BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

Supplies (Dee Overholt): Pat Jubb said need to send ride management packets to southwest-area rides because of need for reporting worker points, ride results, fees, etc. Pat continues to experience problems in timely reporting from rides on this critical info. Check sheets with SASE to each ride management will be used this season for faster response to Pat.

Nominations (Dean Schrader): Dean and Susie Witter were thanked for their efforts for the 1994 BOD.

Convention: Sue McKelvy reported of a request by JR Kendall regarding Region III provide free convention access to a trucker who proposes to haul NATRC secretarial files and furniture at that time. Response was negative as it is BOD's feeling that this is a National NATRCrelated business expense. Dean will contact Mr. Kendall about this issue. Discussion of selling NATRC-related items for sale at the convention. Laurie Butterfield will check with Gloria Becker about providing these items. Kathryn discussed the doorprizes be mailed or brought to her. Use of imagination and funny bones is encouraged when selecting the prizes. (Just wait 'til you see some of them!) Membership list will be provided to convention vendors for sales lists, as this has already been done in the past. 

Region III renewal/newsletter subscription

If you haven't renewed your Region III membership, the cutoff date for receiving the **Region 3 Newsletter** will be June 1 of the same year. National members will only receive two complementary newsletters until they join Region III.

Eligibility for Region III year-end awards

All national NATRC members who are dues-paying members to Region III NATRC are eligible for regional placings and awards. Requirements: Open horses and riders must enter three (3) rides per season and accumulate a minimum of 30 points to be eligible for year-end placings. Open horses and riders will be eligible for the Ruth Tyree High Average Horsemanship and Ken Burkdoll Combined High Average Horse/Rider awards if they enter a minimum of six (6) regional rides. All rides started will be counted. Competitive Pleasure horses and riders must enter two (2) rides per season and accumulate a minimum of 20 points to be eligible for year-end placings. Competitive Pleasure horses and riders will be eligible to compete for the High Average Combined Horse/Rider award but must enter a minimum of four (4) rides per season. The top horse in Competitive Pleasure shall be considered as a sweepstakes horse within the class and shall receive 2 additional points as done in the Open and Novice divisions. Novice horses and riders must enter two (2) rides per season and accumulate a minimum of 12 points to be eligible for year-end awards. Horses and riders receive 4 points for ride completion and a sweepstakes horse receives 2 points (18).

Memo to ride managers

Rides are requested to send the results of a ride to national within two weeks after the ride. Region III rider fees should be sent at the same time to the point chairman.

Verification of points and mileage

The point secretary keeps all Region III members' points and mileage each year. You are welcome to verify your points with the chairman by Oct. 15 of the current year, otherwise you must accept the points as calculated by the point secretary. Region III NATRC members who have not renewed their memberships by Mar. 1 of each year will have to pay an additional \$15 secretarial fee if they wish to have either their horse or rider points and mileage recorded. Breed award eligibility

To be eligible for breed awards at each ride, you must send in a copy of your horse's registration papers with the ride entry. This copy will be returned to you the day of the ride.

These lists offer much information and can be categorized by districts, zip codes and include people who have ridden in the past two years.
