
Equestrians spearhead campground

Teton on to greener pastures

n May 8, 1997, Foxton Teton passed away. He had developed an impaction caused by dehydration that developed over a couple of weeks. Because he suffered from arthritis in his knee from an old injury, it was difficult for him to bend to drink from the creek that ran through his corral. As a result, he drank less than he needed during the hot breeding season. He was 20 years old.

Teton will be remembered as a gentleman – both to handle and out on the trail. He was the exemplary Morgan in that he could handle the ranch work, and having horses led off him, plus have the "go" to compete in the open division of NATRC. He was competed in competitive trail in the early '80s, finishing fourth nationally in the American Morgan Horse Assoc.'s Open Competition in 1983. He also won numerous awards in novice and open divisions and several high-point Morgan awards.

At pulse and respiration stops he was always easy to work with and never needed the extra space around him due to being a stallion.

Teton was taken to a Morgan stallion parade once – hauled in the back of Tom Butterfield's flat bed truck with stockracks. He was off-loaded against a bank of dirt and ridden to the barn bareback. Needless to say, that got lots of attention. Because of rain and mud, the show was moved inside which was cramped with many spectators. Other stallions were trotted down the aisle between the stalls, the handlers using whips and such, scattering the crowd. When it was Teton's turn, he went down the aisle with head high and neck arched with everyone petting him as he passed. He received the loudest applause. Numerous times that day many commented that Teton was what they thought of when thinking of Morgans.

His progeny lives on in over 50 sons and daughters, purebred and half-Morgan. Currently, Foxton Bandido (a son) and Foxton Bon Bon Belle (a daughter) are competiting in his footsteps. The image of Bandido and rider Sherry Eckel is being used for the AMHA Trail Ride logo. Teton produced a diverse line of performing offspring from two-day eventing, to working ranches in several western states – even show jumping.

He will be sorely missed, but his traits will live on in the many mares that we have kept over the years. We plan to breed them to our gaited Lippitt stallion Foxton Society Beau. – Thom Harris


