Championship Challenge to be hosted in Region 3

In August, competitive trail riders from across the nation will head for the wild blue yonder of the world-famous United States Air Force Academy and "Go For The Gold" at the third annual Championship Challenge.

The event, organized and sponsored by the North American Trail Ride Conference (NATRC), will be Aug. 23-24, 1997, in beautiful Colorado Springs, Colo. – home of the Olympic Training Center.

Easily accessible off Interstate 25 just north of Colorado Springs, the Air Force Academy offers challenging mountain riding in a breath-taking setting.

Steep forested climbs, stream crossings, high open meadows, abundant wildlife and ridge-line views that reach from Pike's Peak to the Kansas prairie are among the wonders riders can anticipate. Bottom line: Championship Challenge '97 will be a ride worthy of NATRC and its competitors.

Riders will cover about 40 miles of the Air Force Academy's varied terrain each day, going 5 1/2 to 6 miles per hour. Judging the ride will be Nancy Loving, DVM, Stephanie Ostrowski, DVM, and horsemanship judges Kathy Morris and David Shannon.
