ATTENTION NOVICE RIDERS!

With a new ride season about to start, it is important to be aware of the NATRC rules regarding eligibility when competing in Novice Division.

"Any horse and rider combination having won 5 firsts in horse shall not compete for awards in Novice Division. 4-year-old horses are exempt from this rule.

"Any rider having won 5 firsts in horsemanship shall not compete for awards in the Novice Horsemanship Divison."

First places are cumulative over the years. If you start the season in Novice Division you might accumulate one or two more firsts; then you would have to ride HDC for the remainder of the year, making you ineligible to continue gaining year-end Regional points. You should consider moving up to CP or Open division at the beginning of the ride year.

SUMMARY OF MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING - 2/12/00 ALBUQUERQUE, NEW MEXICO

Meeting was called to order at 12:00 P.M. by Judy Mason.

Minutes of last meeting were approved as read.

New officers for the year 2000 were elected: President, Judy Mason; Vice-President, Donna Schriefer, Secretary, Judd Adams; Treasurer, Marc Shanor.

Report of outgoing treasurer Ike Mosgrove was approved as read. Ike reported that Judi Tobias had completed an informal audit of the books and reported no problems. The Region is in good financial shape, due especially to the highly successful vest number auction begun in 1999. Current balance in all accounts if \$16,863.06, showing a net gain for the year of \$6,118, based on income of \$11,908 and expenses of \$5,790. The Board voted that the money from the vest number sales will go into a Reserve Fund to be used when needed.

Jenny Smith, seminar co-chair, reported that profits from the conference will be divided 50/50 between National and Region 3.

Ike Mosgrove, outgoing membership chairman, reported that the membership for 1999 was 152, compared to 121 in 1998, an increase of 31 (25%), including 34 new members. This is as high as it has been for a long time, according to Ike. District 3 is the highest at 66, District 2 is 57, and District 1 is 29.

The Board of Directors voted to award honorary lifetime membership to the Tom Butterfields and clarified a policy decision that lifetime members shall have the same voting privileges as regular members.

Betty Wolgram, Newsletter and Ride Book Editor, reported that we saved \$500 this year on publication of the Ride Book. The Board of Directors voted to publish a summary of the minutes of each meeting in the Region 3 newsletter. The Board approved expenditure of \$121 to purchase Betty a new OfficeJet printer/scanner/fax/copier machine, as her existing one has become decrepit.

Lee Hoth, safety chairman, submitted a written report that there were two reported accidents at Region 3 rides this year. The safety riders did a good job all year, but there were some rides where we could have used a few more. Lee is willing to continue as safety chairman.

Sue McKelvy, supply chairman, reported that we are running out of vest numbers and need to be thinking about replacing all the vests, as they are wearing out, and changing our numbering system. Decision tabled until April 16 meeting.

Board approved the payment of memberships for the year 2001 for Sue McKelvy and Kris Cummings as compensation for their work.

Linell Miller agreed to take charge of the Region 3 booth at Horse Expo 2000 in

Rider - Owner overstepping its bounds.


Farrier - Disposable surrogate owner, useful for acting out aggression without compromising food supply.
