Seminar goers were treated to presentations by Dr. A.D. Fails, CSU, horse eye anatomy and vision; Dr. Gary Pallaoro, Golden Animal Hospital, basic first aid for horses; and Dr. Dean Hendrickson, CSU, use of nutraceuticals. -

Bill Smith served as moderator for a panel presentation by Steve Ancell, Betty Wolgram, and Mike Mason, who discussed various ways to make our rides both management and rider friendly.

The last order of business for the day was the general membership meeting held about two o'clock. Members were introduced to the new Board members and updated on the latest NATRC policies. The board will discuss other options for encouraging new competitors at our first board meeting in March. We'd love to hear other ideas!

Speaking of dropping at the last minute, you will notice when the ride book comes out that many of the rides have increased the deposit necessary to hold a place. Hopefully, this will encourage competitors to plan which rides they will be able to make more carefully. The judges don't always like full rides, but management sure does. If you are signed up for a ride and find you can't make it, please cancel as soon as possible and give someone else a chance to use your slot. (Yes, this is a sore spot with me!)

Report approved by the Board.  
Minutes: Read by Judy Benham  
with some discussion afterward  
regarding the funding for the  
junior rider program. Minutes  
approved by the Board.  
Old Business:  
Newsletter/Ride book report:  
Betty Wolgram reported that the  
newsletter will be printed as  
soon as possible after the  
conclusion of the 2001 seminar.  
Subscriptions for non-members  
was affirmed at \$10/year. The  
ride book is essentially  
completed except for advertising  
and should go to the printers  
around the first week of  
February. Betty is no longer  
going to be responsible for  
securing the advertising for the  
ride book and requested that at  
least two people be found to  
take over the job. Gary Inman  
was volunteered as ad man for  
the East Slope. Recruitment  
will continue to fill the other  
position, preferably with  
someone from the Western  
Slope.

Awards: Kris Cummings  
reported that the purchasing of  
glasses and items awarded to  
riders and volunteers at  
year-end had been done and that  
all was ready for the awards  
banquet Saturday.

Supply: Sue McKelvy  
addressed the issue of filling out  
the numbers of vests needed to  
accommodate additional riders.  
After discussion, the Board  
approved for this ride season

replacing Novice #73 and  
making additional novice vests  
#111 through #120, at a cost of  
\$15 per vest.

Nominating Committee: Donna  
Schriefer reported that 246  
ballots were mailed out to  
Region 3 members and 125  
were returned. She said finding  
people willing to run for the  
Board was difficult and that  
there were not many "contested"  
positions. The Board thanked  
her for her efforts.

Historian: Janine Ancell  
brought a number of scrapbooks  
for members to review at the  
seminar. She requested help  
identifying some of the people  
and horses in the photos. She  
also said that she needs photos  
from the past few years to  
continue building scrapbooks  
and maintaining our region's  
history.

Horse Expo: Linell Miller will  
again chair the Region 3  
NATRC booth at the Expo on  
March 30-April 1. The Board  
approved funds not to exceed  
\$300 to cover expenses.

Mentor Program: Betty  
Wolgram reported that the  
mentor program which was  
tested on an individual basis last  
season needs to be fully instated  
with a leader this year.

Discussion followed and it was  
decided that ride entry forms  
contain a box to check for new  
or inexperienced competitors to  
request a mentor for that ride  
and another box for experienced  
riders to check that they would  
be willing to serve as a mentor  
for that ride, and the ride  
secretary would match them. A  
signup sheet for potential  
mentors was also suggested.  
New Board member Doreen  
Portner will head the mentor  
program.

Louis Pavetti Memorial: Sue  
Benjamin reported that the

Rabbit Valley Ride has been renamed in honor of Dr. Pavetti and will have a designated trail on Wild Horse Mesa. The cost of the BLM markers was funded by Region 3's donation of \$75 and other donations, and additional donations are still being gratefully received.

**New Business:**

**Election of Officers:** Officers for the Board for 2001 are Judy Mason, president, Doreen Portner, vice president, Marc Shanor, Treasurer, and Tracie Scarlett, Secretary.

**Dues Issues:** Steve Lindsey, Chair of the NATRC Insurance Committee, spoke about the rationale behind the new dues structure.

**Clinics:** Clinics must now be sanctioned although there is no charge for sanctioning. Sanctions should be sent in two months prior to the clinic date if at all possible. Insurance for clinics with horses is \$93/day if no vehicles are used to transport volunteers and \$146/day if vehicles are used. There is no insurance required if the clinic does not include horses. Each region will receive up to \$300 from NATRC to defray insurance expenses and must divide the money among the clinics, i.e. six clinics held, each clinic will receive a \$50 reimbursement.

**National Board Report:** Kathy Shanor and Bill Smith reported that a season weight card was proposed which would eliminate the necessity of riders weighing in at each ride. A card attesting to the weight classification would be issued at the first ride entered and then presented at check-in at subsequent rides. Borderline weight riders could still be weighed during the rides by ride management. \*Editor's note: Riders need to be aware of

the new rules change that weight classification must be maintained throughout the ride or horse/rider will receive completion points only.

National has also voted to add regional C/P and Novice awards for 1st through 6th place horse and rider team which will be presented each year at the National Convention.

**Safety Chairman:** Lee Hoth reported that the first aid kits need supplies and submitted a list. Bill Smith volunteered to re-supply the first aid kits. Lee also stated that there were four reported accidents during the 2000 ride season.

**Other:** Topographical maps are now available on a CD. Topo maps are recommended for rider packets. These CD's can be calibrated to GPS units and this was done last year by Island in the Sky ride. Questions about this can be directed to Mike Mason.

The next Board meeting will be held Saturday, March 10, at 11:00 a.m. at Judy and Mike Mason's ranch in Cedaredge. Masons will provide chili and members will bring potluck dishes to share.

Meeting was adjourned at approximately 9:30 p.m.

Tentative clinics will be Boulder, Cavalier, Linda Fisher, Farmington, and Delta/Cedaredge. Clinics need to be sanctioned and need to purchase insurance if there are horses and vehicles to transport volunteers involved.

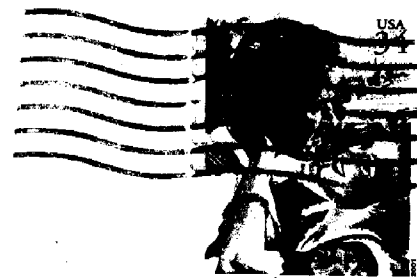
