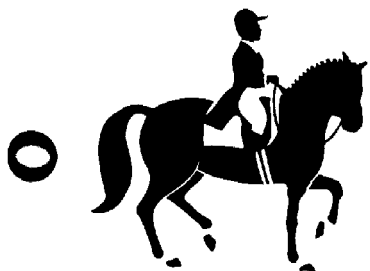

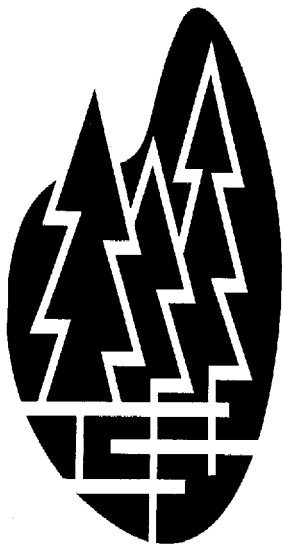

Pine Ridge Ride - Worth the Drive!

Yes, northwest Nebraska seems like a long way to drive for many of you. For me it is actually one of the closer ones! If you haven't been to this ride, you definitely should put it on your schedule for next year. Plans are to hold it on Labor Day weekend next year, which should make it easier for more to attend over the 3-day weekend.

Along with spectacular scenery (pine-covered hills and wildflowers), it boasts safe, well-marked trails, excellent maps, friendly volunteers and is very well-managed. Theresa Haynes and her crew did an excellent job!

The campground was at the base of towering white cliffs with a creek at the bottom which provided water and lush grazing for the horses. It was a wonderful play area for the children!

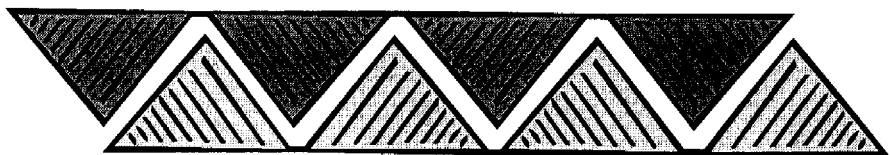
Everyone was checked in on Friday evening so we were able to hit the trail at 6 A.M. Right out of camp, the trail wound along the creek, crossing it several times—one of the crossings judged! Then we started climbing the hills, covered with lush, fragrant pines and dotted with scenic rock outcroppings. Many times we rode along ridges that offered spectacular views in all directions. The hill climbs were broken up by large grassy meadows where we could get in some long trots and even canter a bit! We really expected to see elk at any time as there were plenty of antler scrapes on the trees, but we were probably too noisy to sneak up on them.

We couldn't have asked for better weather, needing jackets until the first P&R. Fresh breezes helped cool the horses at all P&R stops. Natural water was scarce in the area, but the trail was expertly planned to make use of several large stock tanks that the horses really appreciated.

The judges, Pat Regier, DVM, and Cheri Jeffcoat, were fun and evaluated us with creative, yet sensible obstacles and at challenging spots along the trail.

It was the first competition for my mare, Twilight Mist, a bay Arab-Trakehner cross, that would probably be happier doing three-day eventing! She was real handful the first day, thinking this was surely a race, and that we should be galloping! Finally, after getting a bellyful of water at a stock tank and climbing a long steep hill, she decided it was smart to walk on a loose rein. We didn't place against a large CP class, full of seasoned trail horses, but I was quite satisfied with her performance and improvement as the weekend progressed.

I really want to thank Theresa and all her helpful crew for making the effort so that we can enjoy this unique and beautiful area!

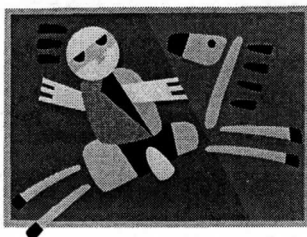

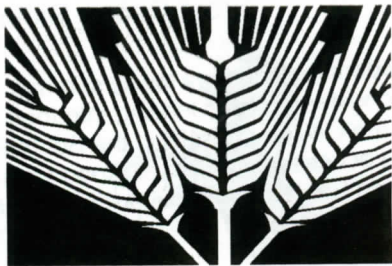
Ft Robinson, Nebraska Report on Riding

Last June some Region 3 riders took their horses on a road trip north and east to the marvelously scenic country of rock formations and rolling sand hills in western Nebraska. Organized and ably led by Susan Peters, under the auspices of the Colorado Fox Trotter Club, participants enjoyed first class accommodations in the mare barn stalls at Ft. Robinson.

This old remount army site housed a number of well-known quarter horse and thoroughbred stallions and many mare and foals during the glory days of the equestrian units of the cavalry. Trail rides from the Fort were many and varied from dirt roads to sandy paths up into the bluffs that surrounded it. Several riders traveled the Pine Ridge trails east of the Fort and others enjoyed the labyrinth canyon trail into Toadstool Geologic Park north of the Fort. The Fort has been restored and maintained with a museum and various outbuildings, barns and homes on its campus. The Pine Ridge CTR takes place nearby.

It was a special opportunity to ride a different portion of the west and feel like one was in touch with history! Many riders trailered north after several days to ride the trails of the South Dakota Black Hills, another region rich in history and the romance of the West.

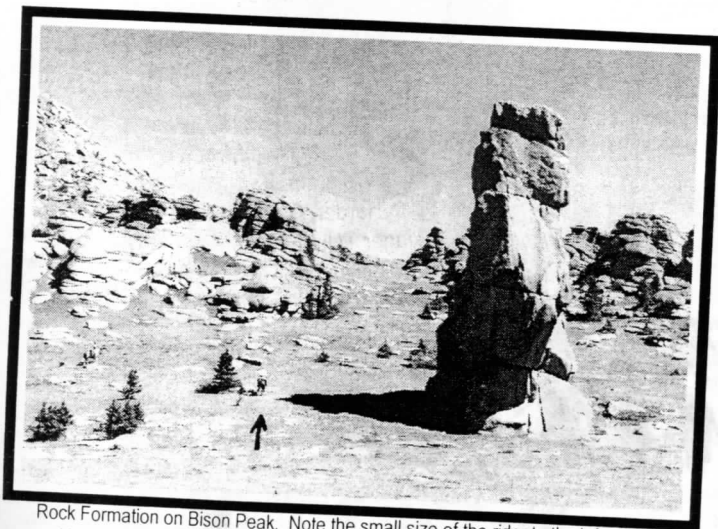
They all are poisonous even if dried and sweet. Sometimes drying a weed makes it more toxic! A good reason for abiding by the weed-free regulations on state and federal lands.

Front Range Riding in Colorado

Riders looking for a lovely summer or fall day's ride might consider the trails leading into the Lost Creek Wilderness. Lost Creek Wilderness is in the South Park area of Colorado. It can be accessed via Tarryall Road from Jefferson, CO or from the Twin Eagles Campground at the other end of Tarryall Road north of Lake George.

A group of us, who regularly ride together for conditioning and companionship, took the Creekside-McCurdy Trail out of Lost Park Campground (19 miles south of Jefferson, CO) and rode up to the top of Bison Peak where we stopped for lunch and some breath-catching and grazing for our horses. The peak area is spectacular with huge red rocks stacked in improbable formations and vistas to other peaks including the mountains around Breckenridge clear to the University Peaks. We continued on to McCurdy Park, notable for more large formations and a beautiful little stream that meanders through part of the valley. Total mileage was approximately 22 miles.

On some of our treks on the trail we've had a huge herd of big horn sheep cross the trail in front of us and seen the white speck of a mountain goat on the higher formations of Bison Peak. There is plenty of water for horses and almost overload of scenery for riders to view! The trail should be passable from mid-June to snowfall in the autumn.





Recently I was able to ride trails in the Flat Tops Wilderness of Colorado and noted that aspens were turning yellow! We still have a number of rides left to be competed and I urge riders to send in their entries now so that ride management has an idea of numbers and the all-important bit of money in the bank to meet expenses upfront. Fall is my favorite time to ride, its cool, dry and sunny and the hues of autumn can't be beat!



We need someone to step up and chair the annual Region 3 Seminar. Volunteer by contacting anyone on the BOD. I've done it in the past (Natl Convention) and it was fun. Okay, it was also some effort and work but still very worthwhile. We can all learn more about our horses and our sport from information presented by speakers, booths and interaction with fellow riders. The awards banquet and the number auction is the highlight that spurs everyone into the spring riding season.

My horse abruptly slid sideways on an obstacle at a CTR that involved backing uphill. Usually it is no big deal, but the hill selected was composed of unstable soil and it crumbled beneath his feet. He suffered a vertebrae misplacement mid-back that formed a big bump and required a chiropractic adjustment to return him to soundness. My horse was not the only one to have problems with the obstacle. It may have broken some ties in the scoring for the judges but it also injured my horse and I did not appreciate it! Riders trust that the judges strive to create obstacles that are safe footing for their horses. I guess I've learned better now!



I wonder about the fact that ride results for NATRC reports Open and Novice Sweepstakes winners but not the High Point winner for CP. Is that class the ugly step-child? Is there a good reason for this oversight? It is time for CP to be recognized for the max achievement just as Open and Novice.

Finally, I hope your riding adventures do not end with our ride season in Mid-October. Several people I know have done overseas horseback vacations in the past and I invite them to share their experiences with Region 3 riders via our newsletter. 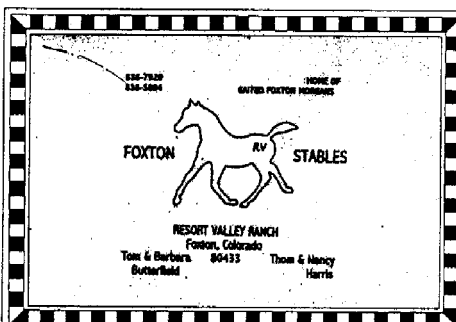
